Cognitive development means the growth of a child's ability to think and reason. This growth happens differently from ages 6 to 12, and from ages 12 to 18. Children ages 6 to 12 years old develop the ability to think in concrete ways. These are called concrete operations. These things are called concrete because they're done around objects and events. This includes knowing how to: Combine (add). Separate (subtract or divide). Order (alphabetize and sort).
