For reference, Reading Level is an indicator variable that takes value 0 if the child can read nothing, 1 if he knows the alphabet, 2 if he can recognize words, 3 if he can read a paragraph, and 4 if he can read a full story. Some examples of past action research projects designed and implemented by students are also included. Introduction to action research. A form of collective reflective enquiry undertaken by participants in social situations in order to improve the rationality and justice of their own social or educational practices, as well as their understanding of these practices and the situations in which these practices are carried out (Kemmis & McTaggart, p. 6). The collaborative nature of action research is highlighted by other writers (Noffke, 1997; Reason & Bradbury, 2011). Specifically, action research initiatives are used within teacher education programs on national and international levels; namely, in Australia and in the United States. As the social action programs of the 1960s and 1970s developed and expanded, social scientists developed evaluation techniques and methodologies to help assess the outcomes of these programs. Evaluation became a requirement for many social programs and a key requirement of federally funded applied research efforts. Many of the social action programs of the time were in the health care field, and many if not all of the major health care organizations participated in these programs with their required evaluation components.
