Course Description

The course will provide a study-discussion-performance format for practical interaction and application with the course content of WO510. The primary work of the class will be the planning and design of worship services, some to be used in the campus Chapel services and beyond, with a secondary goal of providing resources to the local church. Students will construct a biblical, theological and historical matrix through which to critically evaluate worship services as well as develop a series of worship values to inform sound worship planning. Credit only. 2 hours.

Learning Objectives

1. Students will develop disciplines of prayer and discernment relevant to the planning and design of Christian worship.
2. Students will understand, articulate and internalize appropriate and relevant values underlying all Christian worship.
3. Students will gain ability to work as part of teams to plan and lead worship.
4. Students will demonstrate an ability to design a variety of different styles of worship services applying consistent theological, biblical, pastoral and historical concepts.
5. Students will gain exposure to a wealth of worship resources and develop a worship resources bibliography for future use.
6. Students will develop critical evaluation tools with which to analyze worship practices.
7. Students will gain appreciation for issues relating to worship environment, including time, remembrance, space, symbols, technology, and other issues.

Course Format

Students will work in groups of four to plan, design, and lead worship services. Class will meet together once per week in a two hour session. Generally some class time will be devoted to discussion and evaluation of worship services and some will be given to worship planning and design in smaller groups. Students will also be required to attend Tuesday/Thursday services in Estes Chapel throughout the semester. A student will receive no credit for the class if he or she misses more than 4 chapel services in the semester.

Means of evaluation

The class is graded credit/no credit. No letter grade will be given. In order to receive credit, each student must:

--participate satisfactorily in all class discussions and attend all class-conducted worship services (Generally, attendance at all Estes chapels is required. If a student misses more than 4 Estes chapels services, no credit can be given.);

--develop an annotated bibliography of resources to be turned in on Wednesday, December 5;

--turn in a reading report on Wednesday, December 5, verifying that all required reading has been done; and

--participate satisfactorily within the student's small group as it plans its assigned worship services.

Group assignments

These will be distributed in the first class session.

Each group will create a written order of worship with brief commentary to be distributed to the entire class. Provide a list of all resources used in constructing the service.

Practicum site postings Practicum site postings for the Winter semester are made available to students beginning in mid-September of each year. Practicum: 15 Hours. Course Description: Most early literacy difficulties can be prevented through early, responsive, comprehensive, and coherent literacy instruction. This course focuses on helping teachers to develop greater expertise in identifying and effectively responding to learners who struggle at the early stages of literacy acquisition.
