But there are some actual classics on the track list, including Johnny Horton's "Honky Tonk Man"; Don Gibson's "I Can't Stop Loving You," later covered for a huge pop hit by Ray Charles; and Ferlin Husky's "Wings of a Dove." Even though I have studied American music history and rock in particular, I learned much from this text. However, there are some glaring gaps. To be fair there are only 320 pages but, they just don't do some artist and groups justice based on their respective record sales and concert draws. 70's/80's groups such as the Allman Brothers, ACDC, Bad Company, Boston, Journey, Foreigner, Lynyrd Skynyrd or the genre of southern rock period. Wow, what a huge oversight. But, please not to mention Foreigner and Journey in either the 70's or 80's chapter with all the hits between them strikes me as ridiculous. It would be like forgetting to mention the Stones and the Who in the 60's. It doesn't matter whether you like these groups or not, their record sales say much of America did.

Ewen often adds interesting anecdotes surrounding the songs, songwriters, composers and performers.

His second book, *Hebrew Music*, came out the same year, and 1933 saw the publication of *Wine, Women and Waltz; A Romantic Biography of Johann Strauss, Son and Father* and *From Bach to Stravinsky: The History of Music by Its Foremost Critics*. *Composers of Today* followed in 1934 and a second edition appeared in 1936. 1936 also witnessed Ewen's marriage to Hannah Weinstein, a New York teacher. Although still publishing books, Ewen expanded his horizons in 1937 to become music editor of *Cue*, a New York music magazine. Now, thirty or forty titles later, Ewen's career reaches its pinnacle with *All the Years of American Popular Music*. This massive 850-page volume is a stunning work of research and writing.
