"Voices Within the Ark" is the first Jewish anthology in English to celebrate the presence of 350 modern Jewish poets in various languages. That few of the poets will join the canon of universal art should come as no surprise. Mr. Bloom holds little hope for modern Jewish poetry because his vision of Judaism is trapped in static traditionalism and his esthetic perspective does not breach Western cultural history. The "burden of the past," he believes, drowns the would-be Jewish poet today. But why has it not affected contemporary Jewish prose writers, plastic artists or Jewish composers?
