In the twentieth century alone, the American brand of capitalism survived the stock market crash of 1929, the Great Depression, a number of recessions, two world wars, the Cold War, great changes in family and society, and a reordering of the world political map. The modern office has its roots in the late nineteenth century. Following the Civil War, innovations such as the department store, the chain store, and the mail-order catalog business significantly increased the volume of manufacturers' and retailers' sales. For example, a LAN could allow an employee working at a computer terminal in the human resources department to send the payroll records of a new employee directly to a computer in the payroll department. Technology in the workplace can change the way human resource managers do their job. It improves on the process of screening, recruiting and hiring new employees. Many human resource managers are using internet to advertise job openings. Targeted candidates will be in position to apply for these positions online by submitting their resumes to the human resource manager. The use of internet and computers to work has eliminated space and time boundaries. Employees can work from anywhere at anytime, this mobility makes employees stay in control of their jobs.
